POUR OUT YOUR HEART TO GOD

Many times, people say to us, "I have no one to talk to, no one to share my burden with. Nobody has time to hear my cry. I need someone I can pour my heart out to."

King David was surrounded by people. He was married with a large family and had many companions at his side, yet we hear the same cry even from David: "To whom shall I go?" It is in our very nature to want another human being to be present, listen to us and advise us.

When Job became overwhelmed by his trials, he cried out with grief, "Oh that I had one to hear me!" (Job 31:35, NKJV). He uttered this cry while sitting before his so-called friends who had no sympathy for Job's troubles. Instead, they were messengers of despair.

In his sorrow, Job turned to the Lord. "Surely even now my witness is in heaven, and my evidence is on high. My friends scorn me; my eyes pour out tears to God" (Job 16:19-20).

In the Psalms, David urged God's people to do likewise. "Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. Selah" (Psalm 62:8) and "I cry out to the Lord with my voice; with my voice to the Lord, I make my supplication. I pour out my complaint before him; I declare before him my trouble. When my spirit was overwhelmed within me, then you knew my path. In the way in which I walk.... I cried out to you, O Lord: I said, 'You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living" (Psalm 142:1-5).

I believe in my heart that this message is an invitation to you from the Holy Spirit to find a private place where you can frequently pour out your soul to the Lord. You can speak to Jesus about everything — your problems, your present trial, finances, health — and tell him how overwhelmed you are, even how discouraged you are. He will hear you with love and sympathy, and he will not despise your cry. For centuries he has answered the heart-cry of everyone who has trusted his promises. Likewise, he has promised to hear you and guide you. Indeed, he has pledged by oath to be your strength. Go to him, and you will come out renewed.

DISTRICT DEPUTY INPUT:

The Star Council Award recognizes outstanding achievement in membership, insurance and programming. Earning a Star Award is the marker of a high-performing Knights of Columbus council and the goal to which every council should strive. In order to achieve the Star Council Award, a council must earn the Father McGivney, Founder's, and Columbian Awards.

Additionally, the council must submit both the <u>Service Program Personnel Report</u> (#365) and the <u>Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity</u> (#1728) by reporting programs (Form 10784) in each of the four program categories. Councils must also be fully compliant with applicable childhood safe environment requirements.

Prior to the end of the fraternal year on June 30, make sure that your council achieves the requirements to qualify for your awards. To view your quota and/or progress towards earning the Star Council Award, please log on to Officers Online regularly.

The Columbian Award recognizes excellence in your council's programming and charitable outreach. To earn this award your council must conduct and report programs (Form 10784) in each of the four program categories (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) for a total of 16 program credits, with four in each category. A completed *Columbian Award Application* (#SP-7) must be received by the Supreme Council office by June 30 in order to earn this award.

Virtual/remote programs can be counted in the same way they would have been if conducted completely in person. Hybrid events can only be counted once (not as both an in person AND virtual/remote event).

There are **NO** required programs.

Featured Programs - The Supreme Council has designated four programs as featured programs in each of the program categories. When your council conducts a featured program and satisfies the associated requirements it will receive two credits towards that program category on their <u>Columbian Award Application</u> (#SP-7). The featured programs for each category are listed below.

Faith - Refund Support Vocation Program (RSVP), Holy Hour, Spiritual Reflection, Into the Breach
Family - Food for Families, Family of the Month, Family Prayer Night, Family Fully Alive
Community - Coats for Kids, Habitat for Humanity, Global Wheelchair Mission, Leave No Neighbor
Behind

Life - March for Life, Special Olympics, Ultrasound, Pregnancy Center Support

FIELD AGENT COMMENTS:

Blessed Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus 140 years ago with two purposes in mind: To strengthen men in their faith and to provide for the widow and orphan if the breadwinner died or could not work.
