DISTRICT DEPUTY INPUT:

Have you heard about the national Eucharist revival? The official start was on June 19, the Feast of Corpus Christi. Many Knights Of Columbus were able to take part in the start because they served as Honor Guards in Eucharistic processions at their parishes. Whether they realized it or not, they were part of a movement to see Catholics "healed, converted, formed, and unified" by encountering Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Why is this important? A Pew study from 2019 revealed that as many as 70% of Catholics do not believe or understand the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist through Transubstantiation. Also, this Eucharistic crisis was worsened by the pandemic which actually prevented almost all people from attending Mass and receiving the Holy Eucharist. I don't pretend to understand fully the consecration of the hosts and wine. I guess this is why the Priest calls us to profess the Mystery of Faith, "When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death oh Lord, until you come again", because it's a mystery. The having faith part is for all of us, fundamental to our Catholicism. While we don't fully understand, we believe Jesus Christ comes to us in this unique gift of Jesus in the Eucharist, and is someone to cherish and protect. That is one of the main reasons I am a Knight of Columbus, and I'm sure you feel the same way.

The Eucharist revival is spearheaded by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. It is great that the Knights of Columbus are involved with organizing processions and Catholic involvement, and are a key part of the movement. Knights are working with the Bishops to remind Catholics of the incredible gift we have from Jesus in the Eucharist, and to revere that gift and hold it up as a reminder of what we have. The Revival will end in Indianapolis in 2024 at its finale.

We must all remember that this incredible gift of our Lord becomes more valuable the more He is received.

Start planning how are you and your Council will be part of the Eucharistic revival. This is a big deal and next year when the Revival reaches out to parishes and Catholics, we as the Knights of Columbus should be leading the effort. Soon you will start seeing increased Knight activities happening around the US. We must work with our pastors to see if they have ideas for involving Brother Knights with the parish.
